

# **Evaluation of the Network Code on Capacity Allocation Mechanisms**

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## Legal Basis (Gas Regulation)

Article 6 (7):

ACER shall provide a reasoned opinion to ENTSOG within 3 months (including potential PC)



Article 6 (8):

amend the NC in the light of the opinion and resubmit it to ACER



Article 6 (9):

Once ACER is satisfied that the NC is in line with the FG, ACER submits the NC to EC and recommends its adoption



#### **Process**

- NC CAM officially submitted on 6 March 2012
- ACER has 3 months to provide a reasoned opinion to ENTSOG
  - Deadline 6 June 2012
- ACER <u>may</u> formally consult
  - But timing may be too tight
- Once satisfied that the NC is in line with the FG, ACER recommends its adoption to the EC



## **FG CAM objectives**

- The objectives of the FG:
  - » to ensure more <u>efficient allocation of the capacity</u> at the interconnection points between two or more Member States or within the same Member State;
  - v to <u>support the creation of an efficient gas wholesale</u> <u>market</u> in the EU.
- The NC adopted according to the FG will be evaluated taking into account the degree of compliance with the FG.
- Overarching objectives maintaining security of supply, completion and functioning of the internal market and cross-border trade, including delivering benefits to the customers - to be respected.



#### Main issues

- Compliance with FG CAM and development of the Single European Gas Market
  - » Products: breakdown of capacity services between LT/ST, products (yearly/quarterly)
  - » Contract standardisation
  - » TSO cooperation: capacity calculation at IPs
  - » Interruptible capacity alignment
  - » Auction design: auction algorithms to be assessed
  - » Tariffs: the necessary minimum measures or broader?
  - » Compatibility with measures relating to CMP, Balancing and Tariffs
- ENTSOG recommendations
  - » Sunset clause
  - » Auctions for WD interruptible capacity
