Context



- Transparency is key to efficient functioning of markets widely recognised that further improvements are needed across EU:
 - Generation data
 - Transmission/interconnector data
 - Load data
- We welcome regulators' review of power market transparency requirements –
 EFET has already set out its thinking on what is needed
- Entsoe.net is therefore not the complete picture but is an important piece of the (not finished) jigsaw
- Transparency platforms can help markets work better by providing a 'one-stop shop' but they are only as good as the information they are based on
- Therefore primary responsibility for ensuring publication must rest with the asset owner based on consistent EU rules

Positive experiences with Entsoe.net



- Well developed platform
- Consolidated source of information
- Accessed on a daily basis for variety of data sets
- Vital in understanding the European power markets
- Used in conjunction with other transparency data sources

Things that could be improved



- Consistency of data with other sources (e.g. TSO websites)
- Presentation of data (e.g. net flow rather than flow per direction)
- Access to downloadable raw data direct FTP access is desirable
- Missing / Incomplete data sets
- Forward looking data
- Technical site support response time
- Data reliability is key!

- Pan-European scope
- Intuitive, well presented platform
- Login required
- Data needs to be manually downloaded
