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#### SESSION 3 DYNAMIC REGULATION

Chair: Ms Annegret Groebel

One of the core elements of CEER's 3D strategy from 2019 to 2021 is dynamic regulation. This session focuses on dynamic regulation and engages participants in a useful exchange on issues such as ensuring regulation anticipates and, as appropriate, adapts to market evolutions, how to regulate an industry/network with potentially continuing reduced energy volumes and more intermittent sources, how to move from static regulation to more dynamic regulation and how to regulate infrastructure for different purposes. This session will also address the longer term impact of the coronavirus crisis on regulation and possibly lessons learnt.
