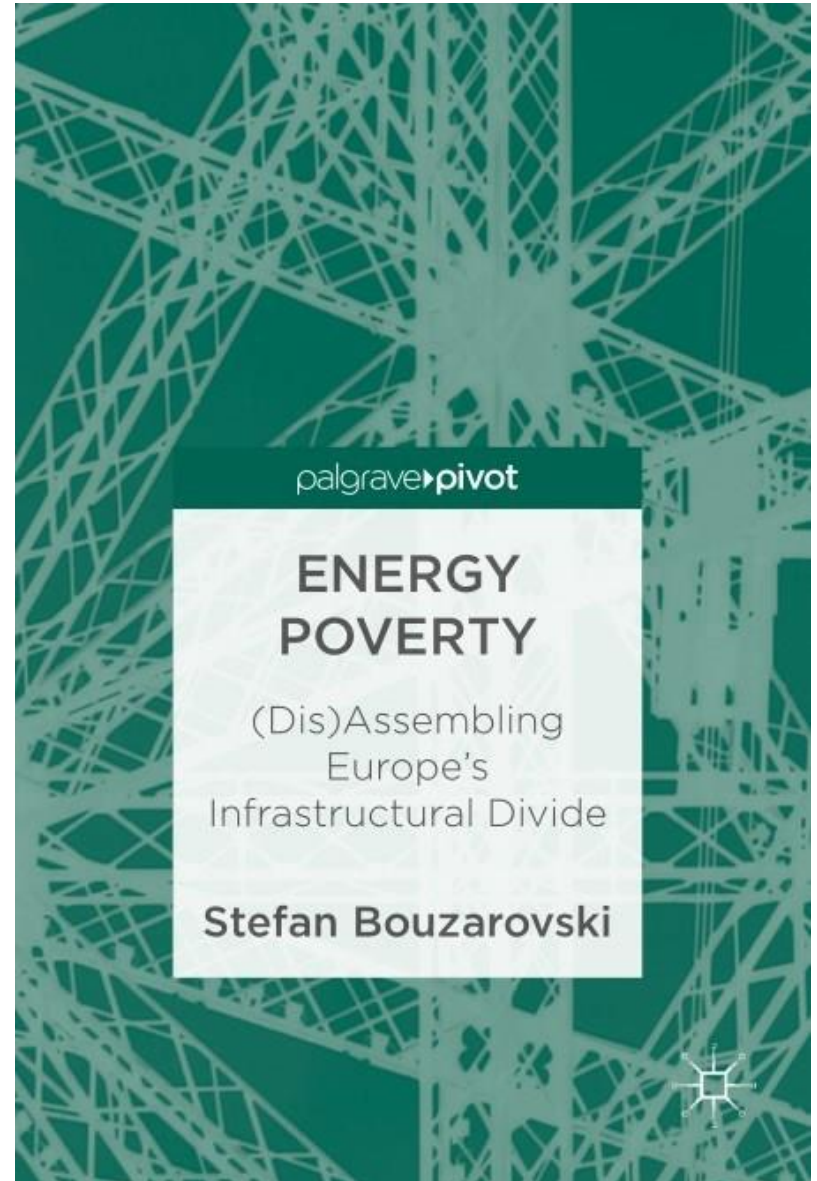



Methodological innovation

- Critical interrogation of existing measures
- Wider range of indicators
- Expansion of modelling-based approaches
- New methods: ethnographies, direct measurement, labs

 - Behaviour change at the household level does not alleviate energy poverty
 - Collective and comprehensive approaches are key
 - The benefits of energy poverty mitigation extend beyond the energy domain
