

Update on the work on ERGEG advice on Fundamental Data Transparency in Electricity –

The European Commission invited ERGEG to give advice on a legally binding guideline concerning fundamental transparency rules by the end of 2010

- → Cooperation and consulting:
 - → Close cooperation with ENTSO-E
 - → Early and full consultation of stakeholders



The Commission request to ERGEG

- Article 18 process deviates from the normal procedure of 1) Framework guideline and 2) Network code
- Speedy process as the need for transparency rules was agreed by stakeholders in the XVII (December 2009) Electricity Regulatory Forum
- ERGEG requested to give advice to the EC and to prepare draft guidelines by the end of 2010 allowing the Commission to make the guidelines legally binding by comitology



Specific points in Ethe request to ERGEG

ERGEGs advice on fundamental data transparency should take into account:

- Existing requirements in the amended Annex A in Regulation 1228/2003/EC
- Experience gained so far
- The work in the Regional Initiatives
- Close cooperation with ENTSO-E
- Full recognition of ENTSO-E's effort to create a single interface for publication of data through a common internet portal



The process

- The establishment of a ToR based joint group of ERGEG and ENTSO-E
 - ERGEGs role to define information items
 - ENTSO-Es role to contribute with regard to status quo of data publication and collection and feasibility issues
- 2. Regular meetings of the joint group with the Commission (DG ENER and DG COMP)
- 3. Seeking inputs and feedback from relevant stakeholder organisations, e.g. from EFET, EuroPEX and Eurelectric
- 4. Impact assessment of fundamental data transparency policy options in progress



The work so far

Technical meetings

- Work based on transparency requirements in the Northern regional initiative
- Focusing on wide transparency
- Requirements and definitions being discussed
- Comparing with EFET requirements



Next steps

- Public consultation of the draft IIA document and the draft guidelines in September 2010
- Analysing the received feedback
- Finalising the IA and the draft comitology guideline by the end of the year 2010
- Submitting advice to the European Commission
