ERGEG Draft Proposal on Guidelines on Inter TSO Compensation

Dear Sir or Madam

Thank you very much for the opportunity to give our comments on ERGEG's proposal on Guidelines on Inter TSO Compensation.

The compensation mechanism between TSO for transit services is an important element to assure and improve cross border trade. In a long term view, the operation and the extension of the European transmission network can only be granted, when operating and capital costs for investments in the infrastructure are covered with the necessary legal security.

For Switzerland as a central country with a well developed transmission grid and a voluminous amount of transit, the compensation mechanism is of prime importance. Under private law, Swiss utilities as some of the founder of ETSO and UCTE are well integrated within the present ETSO scheme, enjoy wide acceptance in cooperation within the relevant technical and commercial bodies.

Currently, Switzerland adjusts the legal framework for the electricity market, especially for the cross border trade, according the principles of the EU-directives and regulations. In addition, the preparatory work to a bilateral agreement between Switzerland and the European Union makes good progress. Within this agreement, the aspects of cross border trade including the element of inter TSO compensation mechanism will be fixed. One can assume, that negotiations will be entered within the next weeks.

Until this bilateral agreement is in force, we support a participation of Switzerland on the basis of private contracts between system operators, as it is intended in chapter 2 (participating entities). The



Swiss federal office of energy supports a pragmatic solution, which allows the implementation of the mechanism and therewith grant for the legal security for further investments into the transmission grid.
