

3.3 Coordinating State interventions in support of resource adequacy

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The resource adequacy assessment is the first step in a significantly important procedure, potentially leading to CRMs. Hence, the underlying methodology must be appropriate.

- Use methodologies from existing adequacy analyses (MAF, outlooks) as a base and develop further
- Regional findings and specifics need to be considered (as the same methodologies shall be used for pan-EU and national assessment)
- Integrate existing work on VoLL and other indicators
- Link to TYNDP process and Risk Preparedness Regulation is crucial to ensure consistency
- The contribution of interconnectors (70%) needs to be properly taken into account'
