WHAT IS THIS COURSE ABOUT?

This introductory course is focused on explaining the fundamentals of EU energy policy and regulation, building on similar successful courses held in previous years. The course is ideally suited for newer staff members within National Regulatory Authorities (NRAs), European Institutions and other public authorities.

This course will comprehensively explain the key aspects of EU electricity and gas regulation, including the latest developments, theories and practices across the energy cost chain, from wholesale markets to networks and retail issues. Attendees will be provided with a clear understanding of the economic and legal frameworks that have developed in European energy regulation, including an explanation of the main institutions and participants involved. The course brings together CEER's senior regulatory practical knowledge and expertise. By combining academic foundations and practical on-the-job regulatory experience, the course seeks to build the operational understanding, capacity and tools for newer NRA staff members, which they can then apply in their work.
