*Subject: request for amendment on the proposal by all Transmission System Operators for the Implementation Framework for a European Platform for the Imbalance Netting Process*

Dear Mr Schmitt,

I am writing to you on behalf of All Regulatory Authorities with regard to the proposal by all Transmission System Operators (TSOs) for the Implementation Framework for a European Platform for the Imbalance Netting Process (INIF proposal). This proposal was submitted in accordance with Article 22 of Commission Regulation (EU) 2017/2195 of 23 November 2017 establishing a guideline on electricity balancing (Regulation 2017/2195).

The last Regulatory Authority received the proposal on 10 July 2018. Article 5(6) of Regulation 2017/2195 requires relevant Regulatory Authorities to consult and closely cooperate and coordinate with each other in order to reach an agreement, and make decisions within six months following receipt of submissions of the last relevant Regulatory Authority concerned. The enclosed document, dated 9 November 2018, elaborates an agreement of all Regulatory Authorities to request an amendment to the INIF proposal by all TSOs and is intended to constitute the basis on which All Regulatory Authorities will each subsequently request an amendment to the proposal pursuant to Article 6(1) of Regulation 2017/2195.

This agreement of All Regulatory Authorities shall provide evidence that a decision on the INIF proposal does not need to be adopted by ACER, at this stage, pursuant to Article 5(7) of Regulation 2017/2195.

All Regulatory Authorities have agreed to issue their national decision to request an amendment to the proposal on the basis of this agreement within ten working days after the agreement reached at the Energy Regulators Forum, i.e. by 23 November 2018.
