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


Introduction



Biennial RES Status Review of Renewable Support Schemes in Europe (D)

Deliverable	Status review
Description / Output	This biennial CEER Status Review provides a comprehensive overview of renewable energy support schemes across Europe, covering data from 2024-2025. It offers comparable insights into national RES (electricity) support frameworks.
Outcome	The review supports regulators and stakeholders by promoting knowledge exchange and encouraging more market-based RES support schemes, contributing to more effective and credible market frameworks.



Electricity

CEER status review on NRA support to the Grids of the Future (D)

Deliverable	Status review
Description / Output	This report reviews how NRAs are addressing the European Commission's guidance on anticipatory investments in electricity networks. Based on a dedicated questionnaire, it maps national approaches and regulatory responses across Europe.
Outcome	The deliverable supports efficient infrastructure use and future-proof investment by facilitating knowledge exchange and highlighting how regulatory frameworks are evolving to enable anticipatory grid development.



Electricity & Gas

Regulatory Frameworks Report of European Energy Networks 2026 (D) (recurring deliverable)

Deliverable	Status review
Description / Output	This annual report provides a general overview of the 2026 regulatory regimes for electricity and gas networks (TSOs and DSOs) across CEER Member countries, as part of CEER's ongoing series of status reviews.
Outcome	The deliverable promotes transparency and supports CEER's strategic priority of optimising market-oriented solutions by showing how national regulatory frameworks incentivise efficiency, investment, and infrastructure use in an increasingly decentralised energy system.



Market Integrity and Transparency

Financial Regulation and the links to REMIT (A)

Activity	Public Consultation/ Conclusion Paper
Description / Output	REMIT II expands its scope to include wholesale energy products that are also financial instruments, strengthening links with financial regulation. It also reinforces coordination between energy and financial regulators. CEER will continue monitoring financial regulation developments and support NRAs in sharing experiences on such cooperation.
Outcome	By promoting regulatory clarity and avoiding duplication of responsibilities, this work enhances the credibility and transparency of wholesale energy markets and supports CEER's strategic focus on effective market mechanisms.

ACER-CEER Energy Retail Markets and Consumer Protection Report (D) (recurring deliverable)

Deliverable	Report
Description / Output	The annual ACER-CEER Market Monitoring Report provides a comprehensive analysis of developments in Europe's wholesale and retail electricity and gas markets. It focuses on consumer protection and empowerment, drawing on CEER national indicators and surveys.
Outcome	This key reference report for EU policymakers supports CEER's strategic priority of empowering and protecting consumers by monitoring retail trends, affordability, and the emergence of new services - helping ensure consumers can confidently engage in the energy transition.



Customers and Retail Markets

Follow-up and sharing of good practice regarding implementation and monitoring of article 18a on supplier risk management (D)

Deliverable	Document
Description / Output	This deliverable follows up on CEER's 2024 report by monitoring how Member States implement Article 18a of Directive (EU) 2024/1711. It will gather and share insights on how NRAs ensure suppliers apply appropriate hedging strategies to manage wholesale market risks.
Outcome	By promoting effective prudential oversight, this work helps protect consumers from price volatility while supporting liquidity and efficiency in short-term electricity markets.

Concept title: Aggregation and Demand Response (D)

Deliverable	Report
Description / Output	This public report will analyse current challenges and best practices in aggregation and demand response, focusing on market dynamics, consumer protection, and technical integration. It will provide a regulatory overview to support informed decision-making.
Outcome	The deliverable will help NRAs and stakeholders improve consumer engagement and participation in demand-side flexibility, supporting CEER's strategic priority of empowering and protecting consumers while promoting accessible, responsive energy markets.

Gas

CEER templates for the market demand assessments on renewable and low-carbon gases to be carried out by LNG terminal operators and natural gas storage system operators (D)

Deliverable	Report/ Guidelines of good practice
Description/ Output	CEER will develop two dedicated templates (one for LNG terminal operators and one for gas storage system operators) to support their reporting obligations under Article 9 of Regulation (EU) 2024/1789. These templates will guide the structured assessment of market demand and investment potential in renewable and low-carbon gases.
Outcome	The templates will facilitate transparent and consistent reporting, enabling regulators to better evaluate infrastructure needs. This contributes to future-proof investment, supports security of supply, and enhances integration of renewable and low-carbon gases into the energy system.

Gas

Decarbonization Package: a status review of national implementation (D)

Deliverable	Status review
Description / Output	CEER will monitor the national implementation of the Decarbonisation Package, with a focus on renewable and low-carbon gas provisions. This includes gathering and assessing national measures to identify barriers and good practices that impact the adoption of clean gases.
Outcome	This work supports regulatory clarity and future-proof investment by informing national and EU-level policy discussions. It contributes to decarbonisation and gas—power system integration by highlighting pathways to scale up renewable and low-carbon gases effectively.

Regulatory Benchmarking & Legal

Follow up work on NRA independence in a multi-sectoral environment (A)

Activity	Workshop
Description/ Output	CEER will host a follow-up workshop on NRA independence in a multi-sectoral environment, building on its 2025 event. The discussion will explore how NRAs are evolving structurally and functionally to manage increasing responsibilities, including emerging areas such as security of supply, energy efficiency, and sector coupling.
Outcome	This cross-cutting activity supports all three CEER strategic priorities by strengthening the ability of NRAs to maintain independence and deliver effectively amid rapid change. It promotes regulatory clarity, adaptability, and organisational resilience across the evolving energy landscape.

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European Policy

Policy work on EU developments (A)

Activity	Activity
Description / Output	CEER will monitor EU-level developments, particularly related to the Grids Package and other key legislative files. A user-friendly compilation of CEER's agreed policy positions will be developed to support transparency and stakeholder engagement.
Outcome	This deliverable strengthens CEER's advocacy and reinforces its ability to respond to evolving EU policy. By ensuring a clear understanding of the legislative context, it supports the effective delivery of CEER's strategic priorities across all areas.
