

## CEER History Timeline (2000-2025)

The Council of European Energy Regulators (CEER) was founded in 2000 as a voluntary association of energy regulators. Over the past 25 years, CEER has played a crucial role in shaping European energy market liberalisation, consumer protection, regulatory best practices, and the transition towards a sustainable energy future.

2000

Founding of CEER & Early Market Liberalisation



The Second Energy Package allows industrial and domestic consumers to choose their energy suppliers.

CEER formally becomes a non-profit association under Belgian law and establishes its first permanent Secretariat in Brussels.

The European Regulators Group for Electricity and Gas (ERGEG) is created to coordinate regulatory efforts, supporting Internal Energy Market completion.

2004

Expansion & Regulatory Milestones

Unbundling rules for transmission operators gain prominence to ensure fair competition. CEER supports unbundling discussions and strengthens advocacy efforts to safeguard consumers.

2009

The Third Energy Package & Regulatory Evolution

The EU begins liberalising national energy markets with the First Energy Package (adopted between 1996 and 1998), introducing first steps towards competition in electricity and gas markets.

CEER is established as a of association independent energy regulators. Ten national regulatory authorities sign a Memorandum Understanding to enhance cooperation, promote market integration, and improve regulatory practices.

2003

Institutional Strengthening & Energy Market Liberalisation

EU enlargement aligns new Member States with energy market rules, reinforcing liberalisation.

CEER expands by welcoming eleven new members, strengthening regulatory cooperation.

2006

Market Unbundling & Consumer Protection

The Third Energy Package introduces reinforced rules on unbundling of energy supply and transmission, establishes certification obligation of TSOs, strengthens independent regulators, establishes ACER, and creates ENTSO-E & ENTSOG.

CEER contributes to ACER's establishment, reinforces regulatory coordination, and plays a key role in shaping the Third Energy Package.

CEER becomes one of the founding members of the International Confederation of Energy Regulators (ICER) to enhance global energy market integration.

The EU introduces market integrity regulation to prevent manipulation in energy trading.

CEER pilots a transparency initiative, shaping REMIT development.

ACER's Full Operation & Consumer Rights Expansion

The Energy Efficiency Directive is adopted.

CEER & ACER publish the first Market

Monitoring Report.

CEER & BEUC develop the "2020 Vision for Europe's Energy Customers" (reliability, affordability, simplicity, protection & empowerment).

The Gas Target Model, developed by CEER and endorsed at the Madrid Forum, provides a framework for competitive wholesale market development.

2013

Consumer Engagement & Rebranding



The EU sets 2014 as the deadline for full energy market integration.

The Ukraine crisis leads to the European Energy Security Strategy (EESS).

CEER contributes to the EESS, advocating for diversification and infrastructure investments.

CEER Training Academy is established.

2015

Energy Union Strategy & Gas Security

The EU launches legislative reforms for modernizing the electricity market, improving renewable energy integration and strengthening consumer rights.

CEER updates guidelines for comparison tools and identifies barriers to consumer switching of energy providers.

2017

PEER Initiative & Consumer Integration

CEER signs agreements with ECRB and MEDREG to enhance regulatory cooperation.

2019

Adoption of the Clean Energy for All Europeans Package (CEP) & CEER 3D Strategy ERGEG dissolves, and ACER becomes operational.

CEER shifts focus to consumer rights, sustainability, and regulatory best practices.

CEER wins the Energy Transparency Award for its "Energy Trade Data Reporting Scheme."

CEER invites national regulatory authorities from EFTA and EU accession countries as Observers, supporting EU market integration.

2012

Energy Efficiency & Market Monitoring

CEER unveils a new logo symbolising its commitment to energy markets and consumer empowerment.

A dedicated energy customer section on CEER's website provides accessible consumer information.

2014

Internal Energy Market Completion & Energy Union

The Energy Union Strategy reinforces market integration, security, and efficiency; gas security of supply (SoS) becomes a top EU priority.

CEER releases a Gas SoS Concept Paper and a Storage Vision Paper, outlining regulatory options for enhancing flexibility and resilience in gas markets.

2016

Launch of the legislative initiative for the Clean Energy for All Europeans Package

CEER launches the Partnership for the Enforcement of European Rights (PEER) to strengthen consumer protection across sectors.

2018

**Regulatory Cooperation** 

CEP focuses on retail competition, renewables, and efficiency.

CEER launches its 3D Strategy (Digitalisation, Decarbonisation & Dynamic Regulation).

The pandemic disrupts energy demand, highlighting market resilience needs.

The European Green Deal reinforces EU climate neutrality goals.

CEER & BEUC launch the "2030 Vision for Energy Consumers" ("ASPIRE": Affordability, Simplicity, Protection, Inclusiveness, Reliability, Empowerment).
CEER celebrates its 20th anniversary.

2023

Electricity Market Design Reform & Consumer Empowerment

The Fifth Energy Package aligns energy targets with net-zero ambitions and extends regulations to hydrogen.

The REPowerEU plan accelerates renewable transition and energy diversification.

The 2024 Draghi Report on European competitiveness highlighted key energy challenges, including market integration and decarbonisation.

CEER detailly assessed the report, welcoming its ambition but stressing the need to implement existing reforms and uphold subsidiarity, market-based solutions, and regulatory stability.

CEER introduces a new logo and visual identity to reflect its modern regulatory approach.
